Sun 15 Apr	(Arrive in Rome, transfer to Naples)	L D	Overnight NAPLES
	<i>We begin the tour in Naples upon transferring from Rome airport with a light lunch, and then follow that with an introductory tour walking through the Historic Centre in the afternoon.</i>		
Mon 16 Apr	Campi Flegrei, Cumae	B L	NAPLES
	<i>The morning is spent exploring the other-worldly landscapes of a still seething volcanic crater, after which we take you to Cumae, the most ancient Greek settlement on the Italian peninsula. The afternoon is left at your leisure with unlimited free travel on local public transport.</i>		
Tue 17 Apr	Pompeii	B L D	SORRENTO
	<i>Pompeii is the focus of the morning, an ancient Roman resort town buried during the volcanic eruption of AD79 and only rediscovered in the 18th century. After this is lunch at the very entertaining "University of Pizza" in Vico Equense, before we transfer to Sorrento where we shall spend the next two nights.</i>		
Wed 18 Apr		B	SORRENTO
	<i>The day is left free to let you to savour Sorrento the way it should be done – without a schedule to limit your enjoyment of arguably Europe's most famous seaside resort.</i>		
Thu 19 Apr	Capri	B L D	CAPRI
	<i>Today we transfer to the legendary island of Capri. This rocky outcrop has been the holiday playground of the rich and famous from Roman emperors to Hollywood stars, and it will be very easy to see why this is so. A guided walk after lunch will be followed by a visit to a private villa-turned-museum.</i>		
Fri 20 Apr	Blue Grotto	B	CAPRI
	<i>Board a boat this morning to see the incredible Blue Grotto, possibly Capri's most famous attraction, but after this, we shall leave you to wander about the island to discover its spontaneous charms.</i>		
Sat 21 Apr	Positano, Amalfi	B D	AMALFI
	<i>Our boat from Capri shall take you to Positano, passing spectacular coastline along the way, and from here we continue on to Amalfi to stay for the next three days. A guided walk is planned for the afternoon before our seafood dinner.</i>		
Sun 22 Apr		B	AMALFI
	<i>This day is left free to let you to relax. Walk the quaint streets, attend mass at the Cathedral, visit the beautiful town of Ravello by bus or just read a book lounging on the beach if you feel like it. For the more adventurous we offer a guided walk on one of the trails hugging the spectacular coast.</i>		

Mon 23 Apr	Paestum	B D	AMALFI
	<i>Today we take you south of the Amalfi coast to Paestum, site of an ancient Greek city with some of the best-preserved Doric temples in Europe. Along the way we shall also visit a dairy farm to taste the exquisite mozzarella freshly made from buffalo milk.</i>		
Tue 24 Apr	Mount Vesuvius, Herculaneum	B L	NAPLES
	<i>The highlight of today is the visit to the immense crater of Mount Vesuvius, mainland Europe's highest and most active volcano. We then visit the remains of Herculaneum, another town completely destroyed by the eruption of AD79, before returning to Naples.</i>		
Wed 25 Apr	Certosa di San Martino	B D	NAPLES
	<i>Our focus returns to Naples with a visit to the monastery complex of San Martino to see its sumptuous Baroque church and the extraordinary collection of nativity scenes. The afternoon is left at your leisure with unlimited free travel on local public transport.</i>		
Thu 26 Apr	Reggia di Caserta	B L D	ROME
	<i>This morning we visit the Royal Palace and Gardens in Caserta, a UNESCO World Heritage Site often used as a setting in movies, before we head for Rome for our final night of the tour.</i>		
Fri 27 Apr			
	<i>Transfer will be provided after breakfast this morning from your hotel to the airport.</i>		



Note

1. Travel insurance is required for all tour participants.
2. Transfer from Rome Fiumicino Airport is provided at 8:30am on 15 April 2011. For arrivals at other times, please contact Ergo: Travel for separate arrangements.
3. Comfortable walking shoes are strongly recommended as there will be substantial walking on both paved and unpaved ground, sometimes on steep slopes or extensive steps.
